- Law derived from the concept of laws of nature
- This law is built on the following concepts
 - A divine creator
 - A created order
 - Absolute rights and wrongs
 - A fallen (sinful) mankind

- The Bible was preached in expository fashion and sermons were often read to the congregation

- It was common for the minister to wear a black robe when preaching

Origins of American government

British backgrounds

- The Magna Carta 1215

 - King could not force anyone to lend him money
 - King could not put anyone in prison without just cause
 - No soldier could be housed in a private home without the consent of the owner
- In time of peace the laws of the army could not be forced on the public

 - Right of the people petition the King

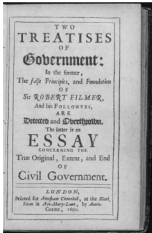

1. Natural law is an eternal moral law revealed to all people through human nature.

2. Natural law influences (but can not save) even fallen and sinful humanity

3. Natural law is the proper basis of political authority.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.—That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, —That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly, all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed.

But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.—Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

The Grievances

1. He has refused his Assent to Laws, the most wholesome and necessary for the public good.
2. He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected to attend to them.
3. He has refused to pass other Laws for the accommodation of large districts of people, unless those people would relinquish the right of Representation in the Legislature, a right inestimable to them and formidable to tyrants only.

4. He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable, and distant from the depository of their public Records, for the sole purpose of fatiguing them into compliance with his measures.

- 6. He has refused for a long time, after such dissolutions, to cause others to be elected; whereby the Legislative powers, incapable of Annihilation, have returned to the People at large for their exercise; the State remaining in the mean time exposed to all the dangers of invasion from without, and convulsions within.
- 7. He has endeavoured to prevent the population of these States; for that purpose obstructing the Laws for Naturalization of Foreigners; refusing to pass others to encourage their migrations hither, and raising the conditions of new Appropriations of Lands.

- 8. He has obstructed the Administration of Justice, by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary powers.

- 23.He has abdicated Government here, by declaring us out of his Protection and waging War against us.

- 26.He has constrained our fellow Citizens taken Captive on the high Seas to bear Arms against their Country, to become the executioners of their friends and Brethren, or to fall themselves by their Hands.

Nor have We been wanting in attentions to our Brittish brethren. We have warned them from time to time of attempts by their legislature to extend an unwarrantable jurisdiction over us. We have reminded them of the circumstances of our emigration and settlement here. We have appealed to their native justice and magnanimity, and we have conjured them by the ties of our common kindred to disavow these usurpations, which, would inevitably interrupt our connections and correspondence. They too have been deaf to the voice of justice and of consanguinity. We must, therefore, acquiesce in the necessity, which denounces our Separation, and hold them, as we hold the rest of mankind, Enemies in War, in Peace Friends.

The Declaration

We, therefore, the Representatives of the United States of America, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be Free and Independent States; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

1. Legislative branch – the making of laws

- The House of representatives
 - Two year term
 - Must be at least twenty-five years of age
 - Must be a citizen at least seven years
 - Must be a resident of the State that elected him
 - The House of representatives shall chose their Speaker and other Officers; and have the sole power of Impeachment.

1. Legislative branch – the making of laws

- The Senate
 - Two members for each state
 - Vice-President is the President of the Senate and has no vote but is the tie breaker
 - Must be thirty years of age and a citizen for nine years
 - Must be a resident in the state he represents

 - Chooses their officers and President when the Vice-President is absent
 - 2/3 vote needed to impeach President
 - Elected to a six year term

 - Each house will keep a record of the proceedings
 - Committees study a bill before it is voted on
 - Committees may kill a bill before it reaches the floor
 - Both houses are paid by the treasury

1. Legislative branch – the making of laws
 - A bill must pass both the House and the Senate before being sent to the President for his signature to make it law
 - A bill may go to a conference committee to iron out differences and report back to their houses for final passage. If both houses approve the final bill, it is sent to the President.

- Salaries set at time of office
- Power of appointments to President

- The President is the Commander and Chief of the armed forces
- Has the power to call special sessions of Congress
- He shall receive Ambassadors and other public Ministers

- The President shall take care that the laws be faithfully executed
- Both a President and a Vice-President may be impeached for, and conviction of, treason, bribery, or other high crimes and misdemeanors

2. Executive branch – the enforcement of laws
 - The President shall have ten days to sign or veto a bill
 - If he does not sign in the ten day period and Congress is in session the bill become law. If Congress is not in session the bill is dead
 - If he vetoes the bill the Congress may over ride the veto with a 2/3 majority in both houses

3. Judicial branch – the interpretation of laws
 - Judicial power in one Supreme Court and all lower courts
 - The lower Courts established by congress are the District Courts and the Courts of Appeals
 - All cases must go through the lower courts before the supreme Court considers to hear the case

 - Criminal cases will be by a trial by jury in the state the crime took place
 - Cases of Treason involve levying war, giving aid or comfort to the enemies, and least two witnesses

- Citizen rights will be consistent among states
- A person charged with a crime who flees to another state may be returned to face trial

5. Methods of amending the Constitution

- The Congress, whenever two thirds of both Houses shall deem it necessary, shall propose Amendments to this Constitution, or, on the Application of the Legislatures of two thirds of the several States, shall call a Convention for proposing Amendments, which, in either Case, shall be valid to all Intents and Purposes, as part of this Constitution, when ratified by the Legislatures of three fourths of the several States, or by Conventions in three fourths thereof, as the one or the other Mode of Ratification may be proposed by the Congress

- All debts before this Constitution shall be paid
- This Constitution shall be the law of the land
- All officers shall be bound by an oath to support this Constitution

Amendment 5

No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offense to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Amendment 6

In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the Assistance of Counsel for his defense.

Amendment 7

In Suits at common law, where the value in controversy shall exceed twenty dollars, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved, and no fact tried by a jury, shall be otherwise re-examined in any Court of the United States, than according to the rules of the common law.

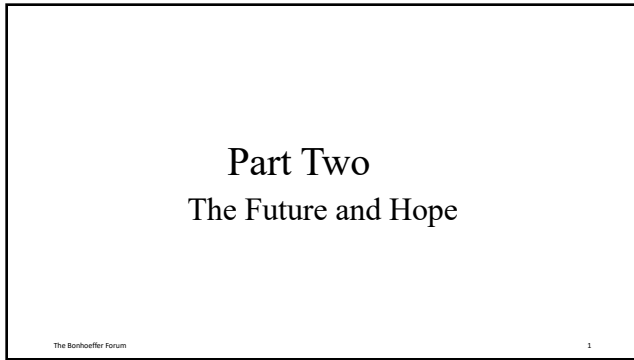

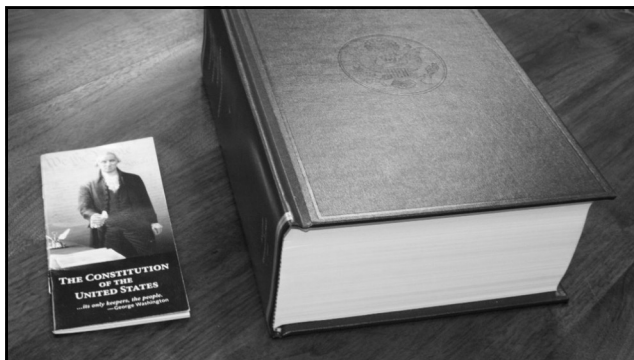

The Radicals

Theodore Roosevelt

- Was placed as Vice President to insure he could not enact bills to restrict monopolies. Became President when President McKinley was assassinated
- Did what he could to stretch the Constitutional boundaries
- Used government control to regulate industry, and social inequity.
- Looked at as a reformer

The Radicals

Woodrow Wilson

- Wanted to change the form of US government having Congress to be in a management role

The Four Freedoms



In the future days which we seek to make secure, we look forward to a world founded upon four essential human freedoms. The first is freedom of speech and expression -- everywhere in the world. The second is freedom of every person to worship God in his own way -- everywhere in the world. The third is freedom from want, which, translated into world terms, means economic understandings which will secure to every nation a healthy peacetime life for its inhabitants -- everywhere in the world. The fourth is freedom from fear, which, translated into world terms, means a world-wide reduction of armaments to such a point and in such a thorough fashion that no nation will be in a position to commit an act of physical aggression against any neighbor -- anywhere in the world. That is no vision of a distant millennium. It is a definite basis for a kind of world attainable in our own time and generation. That kind of world is the very antithesis of the so-called "new order" of tyranny which the dictators seek to create with the crash of a bomb.

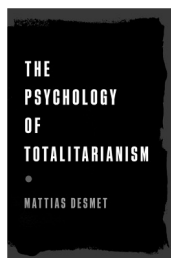

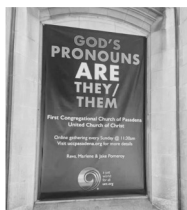

"Us versus them" is social engineered.

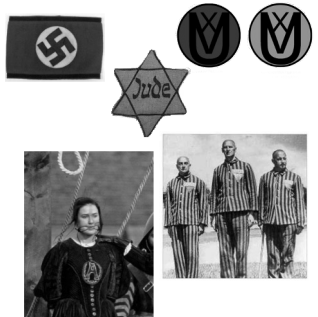
Classifying people by **Ethnicity, Race, Age, Religion, Wealth & Fame, and even HEALTHY versus SICK, or Vaccinated versus UnVaccinated**, is a primary method of dividing society and creating power struggles between groups.

Stage 2: Symbolisation

- ✦ Labels and marks to tell society what group you are in.

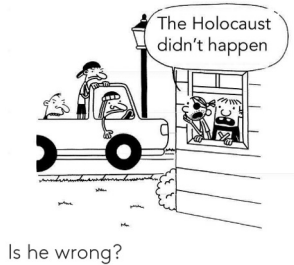

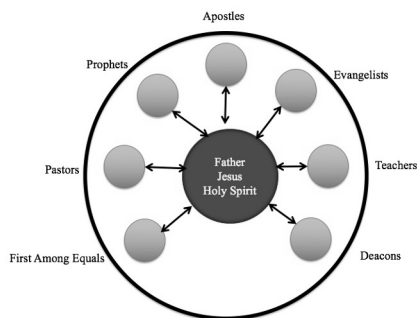
